Chorus: ALL STATE: We held auditions for all state chorus last week and have 20 singers preparing for that in the end of October.

Sideline Cheer: All sideline cheerleaders had been practicing since the beginnig of the school year for homecoming. All of them performed at the homecoming pep rally and at the homecoming football game. The basketball cheerleaders will now have a break until the basketball season gets underway. The football cheerleaders are off this week with the football team going to Rapid City. The cheerleaders will travel to Yankton with the team and then will be off the following week again when the football team travels to Sturgis.

Volleyball: There are some new faces on the team this year. The girls are playing hard and doing well.

Gymnastics: Gymmnastics begins October 31st - we have 32 gymnasts signed up already! Gymnasts will be selling Breadsmith 10 for 10 punch cards and taking orders for Christmas wreaths at Parent / Student Conferences.

Baseball: Over 50 students from grades 9-12 have signed up to play baseball next spring. We made \$212 from selling championship t-shirts and will continue to fundraise through the fall and winter. Last year's team will drop the championship banner during halftime of the basketball game against RC Stevens on Friday, Jan. 6. Many players are involved in fall camps at Augie and through SEBA. Four of our kids

will compete in the Perfect Game Showcase Tournament in Cedar Rapids, IA at the end of this month.

Competitive Dance: Two competitions so far with one third and two fourth places. Several competitions to come, including an invitational meet at Roosevelt.

Competitive Cheer: We began our season on September 10. We did not place last Saturday. We placed 5th at Brookings, and tomorrow (Sept. 20) we have a cheer competition in Huron.

Girls Soccer: The girls' soccer team is off to a strong start. We have played 8 games are undefeated. We have scored a total of 42 goals and only allowed 1 goal to be scored on us. We are currently ranked second behind RC Stevens, which we play on Friday night. We only have 3 games left and then off to State in Mitchell. Our state is Oct. 6-8.

Cross-Country: The boys are undefeated led by Tanner, Ethan and Dylan. The girls are strong and fast, led by Alex Hess. They just won the Huron Invitation this past Saturday (9/17/11) The Varsity goes to the University of Minnesota this Saturday, Sept. 24. This is the first year EVER that Sioux Falls is hosting States at Yankton Trails on Oct. 23. RHS has a multitude of new talents to it's Cross Country team this year and combined with the strength of the upper classmen, the team is poised to repeat a State Championship.
